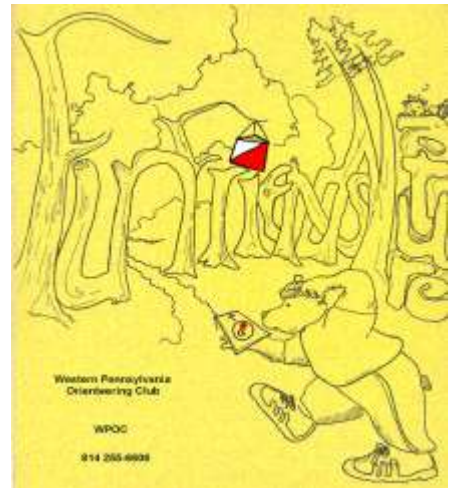
Where: Beaver Library, Beaver, PA

What is Orienteering? Orienteering is a competitive form of land navigation. It is for all ages and degrees of fitness and skill, and all-weather. It provides the suspense and excitement of a treasure hunt. The object of orienteering is to locate control points by using a map and compass to navigate through the woods or other mapped areas.

What to bring? All you will need to bring is a compass (if you do not have one, we can loan you one) and appropriate footwear to walk/jog the streets of Beaver.

Event Details: The course offered is a 60-minute Score in the streets of Beaver (a Street-O), aimed at beginner through intermediate level participants. There is a mass start after the registration period. Preregistration is recommended.
